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

It used to be that you paid your dues in the minor leagues before you got a ride in the major leagues. By that time, a driver was generally in their late 20's, or even early 30's, and more importantly, mature in their behavior and mindset. Yes, they could get rough and fists could fly at the finish, but after all was done, grudges were seldom held long and everyone seemed to get along on the surface.

Today it seems like drivers are starting earlier and earlier, racing in Midgets, Legend cars, or Late Models while still in school. If they show any talent, they are signed to a contract by one of the "big" teams, and thrown in a Busch Car. If they thrive there then it's into the Nextel Cup where they find themselves under the microscope every week with pressures to perform and other younger drivers hoping for them to fail so they can take their

Although the quick rise to the top would seem to be a dream for many drivers, it can quickly turn into a nightmare when it's discovered that they lack the maturity to interact with team members, officials, fans, and the

> media. All sins seem to be forgiven for those who produce on the track and with sponsors, but those that don't are cut loose and thrown to the wolves, fighting for a Busch or Truck seat in hopes of reviving

Jeff Gordon started this trend, but at least he had people around him nurturing him and providing support. After a shaky rookie season, Jeff showed maturity and self control beyond his age and has risen to the level of multiple champion. Unfortunately, he seems to be the exception to the rule. Today we get good/great young drivers with tons of talent behaving like punks.

In their defense, the media spotlight shines much brighter in their face than

it did for previous generations. And everyone gets mad and blows a fuse now and then. So the occasional outburst and media gaff is to be expected. But to continue to misbehave is unacceptable. It shows the sport in a bad light and provides a bad example to the

As in 2004, Hurdle 2005 was run as a Novice rally, however, this year's course wa 117 miles in length. Considerably longer

than your average Novice event, it was an effort to expose Novice and First Time competitors to the length of a Regional Event.

August 6th was a beautiful day with clear skies and comfortable temperatures as nine cars left Southington, CT. Perhaps too beautiful. For the 3 mile measuring runs and 1 official check, the weather was overcast and less than desirable conditions for outside activity. As a result, there were few cars along the road by the golf course at the end of the odometer check. Unfortunately, the nice weather brought out the golfers and the odo check end area was somewhat busy for the 10–15 minutes that the teams were stopped there.

From Southington, the first section of the Hurdle course took the competitors through Plymouth, Watertown, Woodbury, and Roxbury before the morning break in New Milford. The checkpoint crew and teams were able to witness sky diving at the airfield across from control #3 in Roxbury.

At the break, Joe Termineso and Norman Breed held the overall and Class D lead with 61 points. Kelli Lamkins and LeeAnn Greenlaw stood second overall and 2nd in D with 82 points. Third overall was a tie between Karen and Mike Bronson (3rd D) and Sean and Colleen Proctor (1st F) each with 91 points.

Section 2 of the event was the most scenic, winding through farmlands in Washington, Warren, Morris, and Litchfield, CT before a break in Litchfield Center. The first control of this section was a DIY that proved difficult for many of the teams. All learned that signs can be parallel to the road as well as perpendicular, with many failing to see the "Hurdle" sign on a telephone pole. (This wasn't the intent of the rallymaster; it just worked out that way). Teams also got to visit Rabbit Hill Road twice and drive almost completely around Bantam Lake.

Robin Dobrowolski and Carrie September scored a 218 for the section (341 total) to sit in 3rd overall (2nd Class D) while Joe Termineso and Norman Breed scored 338 (399 total) to fall to 4th overall (3rd Class D)

Section 3 was the shortest of the rally. Teams drove through Litchfield, Harwinton, Thomaston, and Plymouth before finishing in Bristol. Route




highlights included a trip through the Roraback Nature Area in Harwinton and a drive by the Thomaston Dam.



They were challenged to precisely follow directions as to where to turn and how fast to drive in an attempt to arrive at secret checkpoints and match the exactly calculated time.

In an effort to involve more of the racing community, the Rally Against Leukemia returned to its nighttime format from a decade ago. With Friday night being void of any racing, organizers gambled that it would bring some of the Road Racing and Solo participants out for some rally fun. Seven teams from the other disciplines entered, as well as a team from Safety Services.

There were three classes of competitors: first timers, novices (less than 5 rallies), and experienced. The experienced class was comprised of the typical A, B, C and S classes from the rally program. Their scores were weighted depending on the equipment they used.

"First Timer" class-winning navigator, Chris DeVries said, "My brother and I had lots of fun navigating the stages, enjoyed the scenery and were surprisingly spot on for newbies until missing a turn on one of the last legs. The laps around NHIS were a treat not to be forgotten as well." Second in FT class were Ted Drotleff and Gus Hoelscher, finishing only 10 seconds back. Third went to James and Rochelle Ray, driving a BMW M3, 20 seconds behind.

All proceeds from the entry fees will be donated to UMASS for Leukemia research. To aid in the charity cause, numerous merchants and establishments donated certificates and goods to the prize pool and services to help defray the cost of putting on the event.



This was a fun, low key escape for the couple.

Solo2 specialist Paul Zahornasky registered to run with fellow soloist Jeff Martynuska. When Jeff got stuck in Friday traffic and couldn't make the start, Paul teamed with Sheryl Turk for the rally. "My navigator and I got so lost that just getting back to the track became a concern. We had a great time and I plan on running again next year," said Paul.

In the novice class, competition was amazingly close. Chang Ho Kim and Melissa Gopnik took top honors with a score of 125, only a minute and 15 seconds off perfect time. High school seniors Mike Beliveau and Bridget Cass, running their second RAL, were only 7 seconds off the leaders. In the most authentic sports car of the event, Colin Davis and Robert Lang drove the 1970 Triumph GT6 to 3rd

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
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SEPTEMBER SOLO NOTES

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VERMONT SPORTSCAR COVERED BRIDGE RALLY/RALLYCROSS

The Vermont Sports Car Covered Bridge is actually two events being run on the first weekend of November. This will be the 39th running of the TSD Covered Bridge road rally on Saturday, 5 November. On Sunday, 6 November, there will be the Covered Bridge RallyCross. Both of these events will headquarter at the Lake Morey Resort, Fairlee, Vermont.

The **Vermont Sports Car Covered Bridge Rally** is a non-trap, straightforward rally and part of the SCCA National Championship [DTR]; the NEDiv Championship; and the New England Rally Championship. The rally will use an instruction format that is designed for beginners, yet challenging to experts. The rally will travel considerable unpaved back [50%+/- of the 150 miles] roads, none of which are car breakers. Some of these roads may not be suitable for all vehicles. The speeds are reasonable for the conditions, however, some people not used to driving on unpaved may consider them to be on the brisk side. The rally will use both manned and unmanned controls.

GENERAL NOTES

- 1. Be prepared to run in any weather sun, rain, or snow.
- 2. The rally could finish after dark.
- 3. Be prepared to run at least 100 miles between fuel stops.

RALLY CLASSES:

Class A: Championship class allowing full rally computers, GPS, etc.

Class B: Championship class with limited mile measuring equipment, no computers.

Class C: Championship [SOP] class with no mile measuring equipment.

Class S: Championship class with stock odometer in stock location.

Class D: Non-championship [Novice] class where no participant has over 50 points.

The VermontSportsCarCoveredBridgeRallyCross will be at the Bradford Fairgrounds off Route and the Bradford Fairgrounds of Ro5 in Bradford, VT. [Exit 16, I91, Route 25, north, left at Jct with US 5]

RALLYCROSS CLASSES:

- 4M Modified 4-wheel drive.
- 4P: Production 4-wheel drive.
- 2M: Modified Front-wheel drive.
- 2P: Production Front-wheel drive.
- RW: Rear-wheel drive.

AWARDS: The awards for the Vermont SportsCar Covered Bridge will be, as they have been for the last 38 years, items from the Vermont Marble Exhibit with additional sponsorship pending.

DIRECTIONS: The Lake Morey Resort is located in Fairlee, VT. Take exit 15 from I91. Turn west and follow the signs. The Bradford Fairgrounds is one exit north on I91; from the junction of routes 25 & 5 turn left on US 5. Entrance will be on right.
